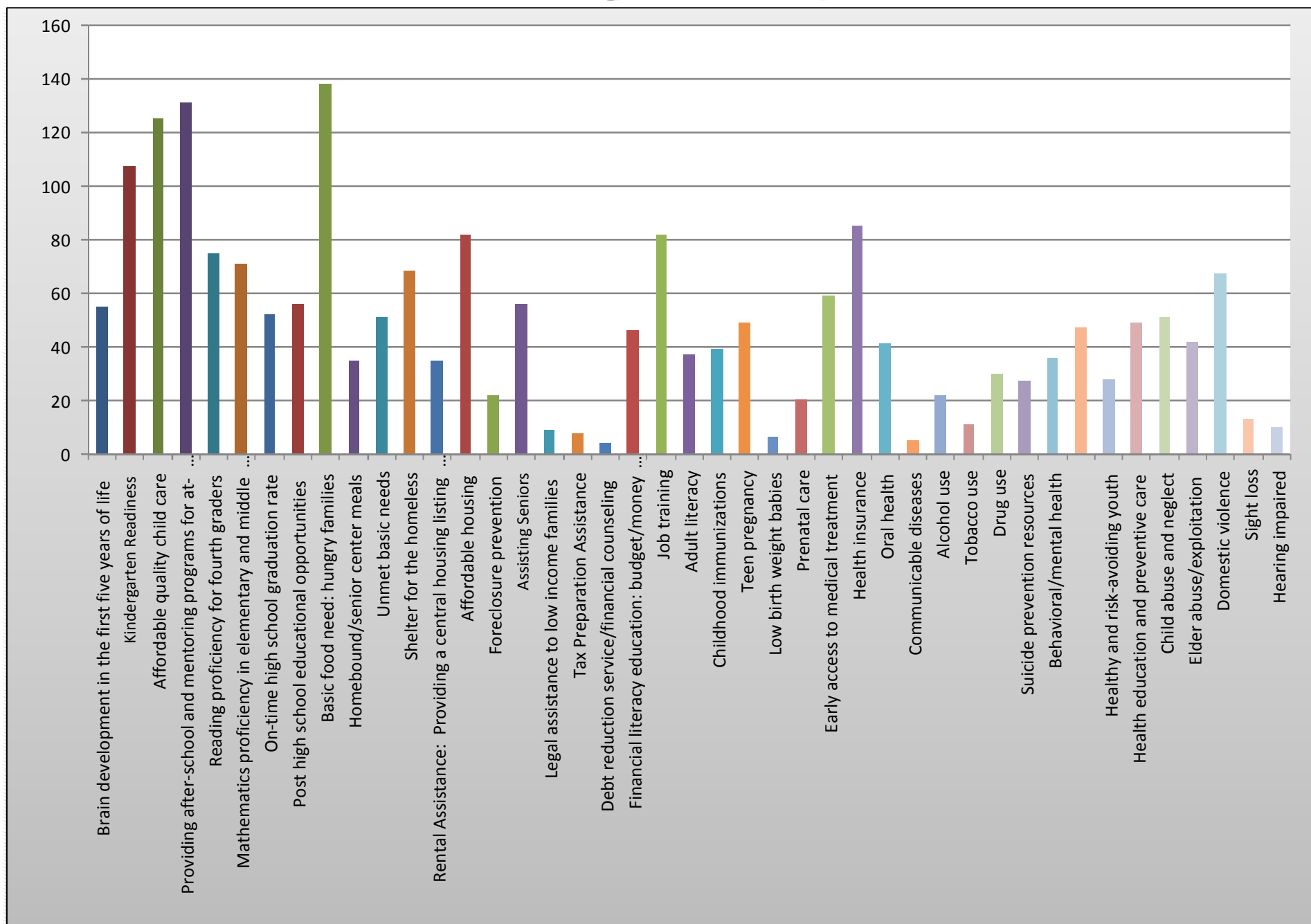


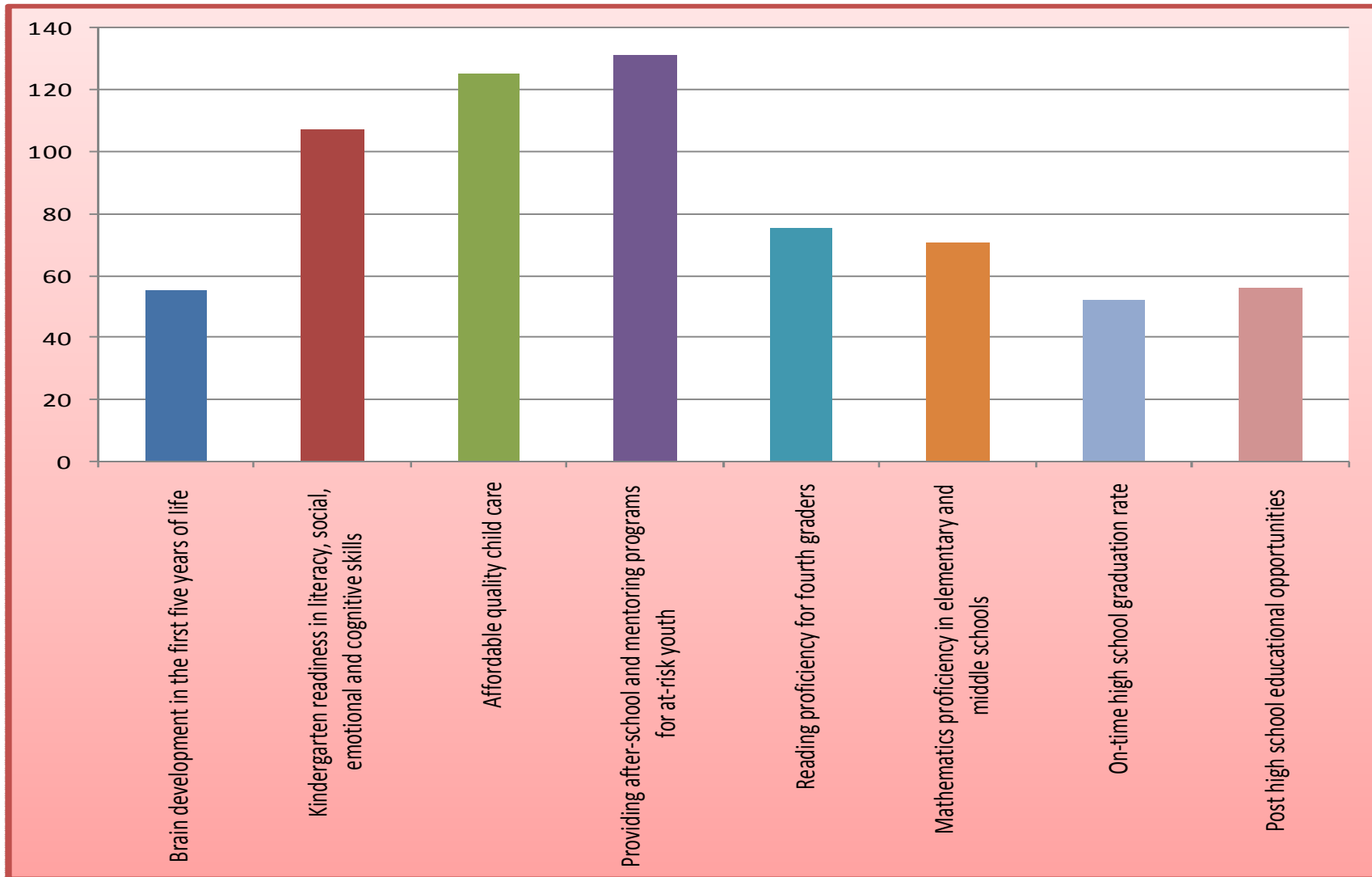

All Categories Compared



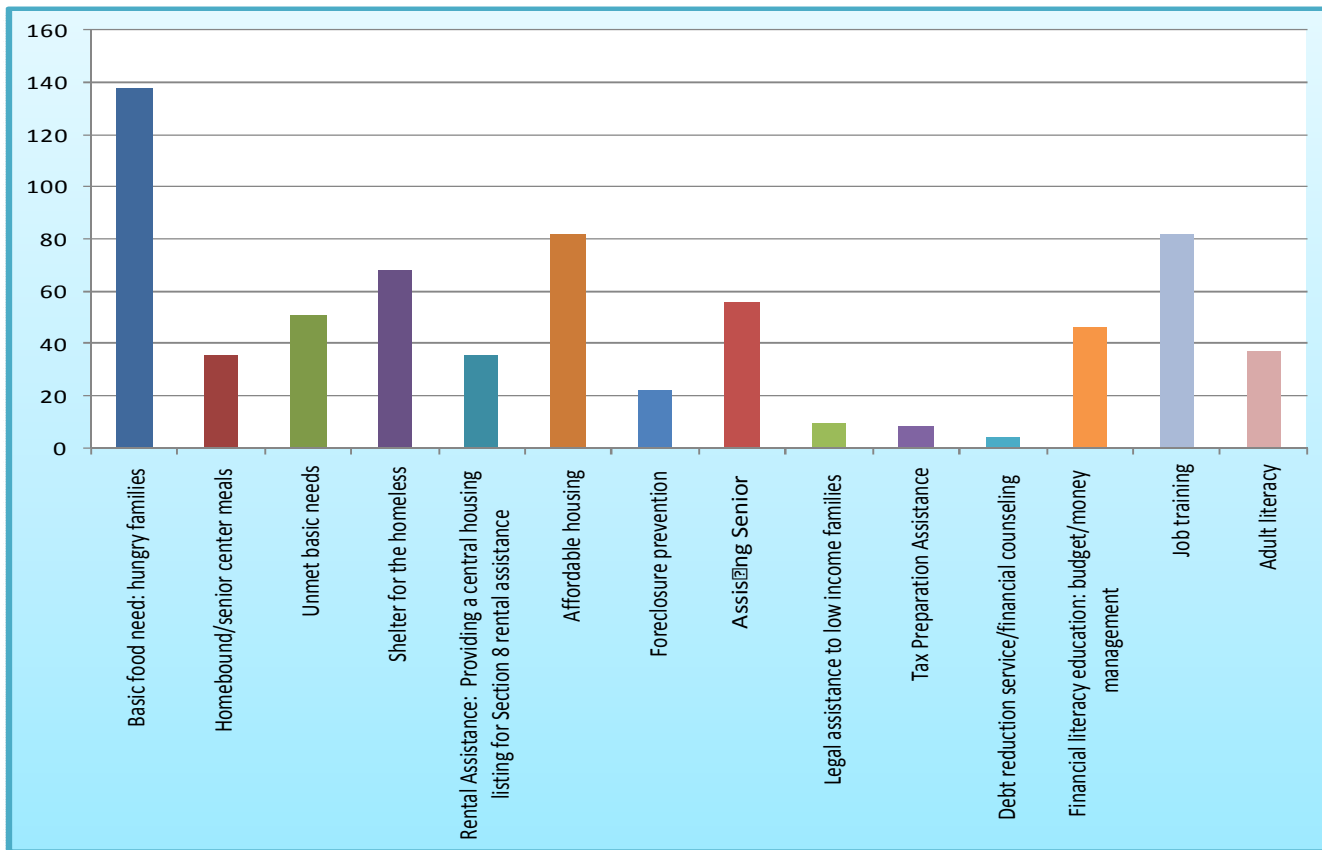
